Clark, who is also the Johnson School's Class of 1972 president, was selected in recognition of his outstanding professional achievement, commitment to community service and embodiment of the Johnson School values of mutual respect, pride and accountability, collabora-

tion, professionalism, integrity, trust, and investment in self.

During his 35-year career with the federal government, including the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission and the U.S. Energy Research and Development Administration, as well as the DOE, Clark actively mentored many federal employees, including participants in the Executive Potential Program, Women's Executive Leadership Program, Upward Mobility Program, and Leadership Transition Program. In 1990, he received a "Point of Light" from the former President of the United States, George Herbert Walker Bush, for outstanding volunteerism. In 2002, he received the DOE Special Employment Entrepreneur Award in recognition of his leadership in mentoring high school and college students and developing proactive funding strategies.
